



## INTRODUCTION

#### **The Municipal and Airport Angles:**

- Many airports municipally owned YOU may well get the call
- Public interest municipalities and counties:
  - Regulating the use of UAS within their jurisdictions
  - Using UAS for public safety and welfare

## **CURRENT REGULATION**

# FAA Modernization and Reform Act of 2012, Pub. L. 112-95, Feb. 14, 2012

- Safely accelerate integration of UAS into the National Airspace System by Sept. 30, 2015
- Establish test ranges
- Case-by-case approval of public operations

## **CURRENT REGULATION**

#### **Non-binding guidance documents:**

AC 91-57 (June 9, 1981) — Model Aircraft Operating Standards — voluntary

Establishes 400' ceiling for model aircraft operations

Policy notice, Unmanned Aircraft Operations in the National Airspace System, 72 Fed Reg 6689 (Feb. 13, 2007)

 Categorizes UAS operations according to whether public, civil or model aircraft

Interim Operational Approval Guidance 08-01, Unmanned Aircraft Systems Operations in the U.S. National Airspace System, March 13, 2008

## **DEFINITIONS**

- Aircraft
- Unmanned aircraft
- Unmanned aircraft system (UAS)
- Small unmanned aircraft
- Model aircraft
- Sense and avoid capability

## **CURRENT PICTURE**

- UAS operations permitted on case-by-case basis
- Safety = ostensible governing criterion



## **CHALLENGES**

#### **Technical**

- Sense and avoid
- Reliable data links between ground and UAS
- General criteria for design, certification
- Radio frequencies

#### Regulatory

- Air traffic procedures
- Pilot qualification
- Safety data reporting and hazard analysis

# MUST AIRPORTS ALLOW AS AERONAUTICAL ACTIVITY?

- Operation of UAS does not depend on airports
- Forthcoming rulemaking may address explicitly
- Airports must accommodate aeronautical activities
- Airport rules and regulations

## **MUNICIPAL CONSIDERATIONS**

#### Regulating UAS use within jurisdiction

- Privacy
- Safety
- Revenue (parklands, etc.)

#### Use for public safety and welfare

- Law enforcement
- Zoning
- Utilities

- Air traffic control no criteria yet
- Safety watch rulemaking
- Huerta v. Pirker
